First Scottish Woodlands Student Excellence Award Announced

The Scottish Forestry Trust is delighted to announce that the winner of the first Scottish Woodlands Student Excellence Award is Dave Auty, a post graduate student then based at the University of Aberdeen, who carried out research into "Modelling the effects of forest management on the wood properties and branch characteristics of UK-grown Scots Pine". The thesis has helped to clearly identify the effects of different types of silviculture on the wood quality properties of Scots Pine and has identified clear areas for further research in the future.

Speaking from Laval University in Quebec City where he is now based, Dave Auty said, "I am thrilled to receive this award from The Scottish Forestry Trust and Scottish Woodlands in recognition of my PhD thesis, and I am extremely grateful to the SFT, Forest Research and the University of Aberdeen for the opportunity to undertake the work and to make a positive contribution to wood quality research in the UK".

Guy Watt, the Chairman of The Scottish Forestry Trust's Projects and Research Committee said "The thesis produced by Dave Auty was an extremely impressive piece of work highlighting some key lessons for silvicultural management of an important tree species in UK forestry. Committee members were impressed by the quality of the final thesis and by the practical relevance of the findings".

Presenting the award to Dave Auty, Colin Mann, Managing Director of Scottish Woodlands Ltd and a Trustee of The Scottish Forestry Trust, said "I am delighted to present Dave with this inaugural award and wish him every success with his future work here at Laval. Not only is it important to recognise achievement through excellence but it is as important to support graduates as they start off on their career path in the forestry sector. The Award provides £250 per recipient as a result of funding provided by Scottish Woodlands Ltd.
